
The entry into the secondary school

We welcome our 5^{th} graders with open arms in the secondary school. The rhythm of the day with hours of self-directed learning and additional activities make it easier to settle in all-day lessons quickly. To ensure that subject-related learning can be successful, we offer interdisciplinary methods training at the beginning of the 5^{th} school year.

We teach basic social skills in grades 5 to 8 through the subject "Social Learning" and our "Fit-4-Life" training, which teaches age-appropriate important topics such as health and the media. Our Psychological-Pedagogical Service offers individual support at any time. Through class trips and exchange programs with partner schools our students get intercultural impulses.

Lessons in the secondary school

Modern English and French lessons from grade 5, as well as bilingual subject instruction from grade 6 (History Epochal and Biology) lay the foundation for the high language competence of our students.





In grade 8, they can choose either the language or the science profile, depending on their preferences. For those focused on language, Spanish is added as a third foreign language. The science branch includes IT as an additional subject as well as practical work in the Sciene Lab. Elective courses such as "Performing Arts" give students the opportunity to try out their skills on stage.

Extracurricular offers

Work groups and lunchtime activities round off the regular lessons in the artistic, musical and sporting areas with engaging and challenging activities.

The high school

Our high school (grades 10 to 12) is characterized by modern forms of teaching in which individual, independent and cooperative work is encouraged. We place particular emphasis on strengthening the natural sciences (MINT focus), and on modern foreign language teaching. The results prove us right: Our students achieve above-average exam results every year.

The German International A-levels

The general university entrance qualification (the German International "Abitur", DIA) is the school-leaving examination of German schools abroad and entitles students to study at universities in Germany and at many universities abroad. In addition to three written and one oral examination, the DIA includes a fifth examination element in the form of a colloquium. Within the DIA, higher foreign language teaching components can be chosen according to individual inclination. For example, we offer History and Social Studies from grade 8 resp. 10 in both a purely German and a German/English bilingual version.
