

Regulations regarding illness and head lice at iDSB

1. Illnesses

- **Diarrhoea/vomiting:** Readmission 48 hours after symptoms have ceased.
- **Fever:** Readmission only after at least 24 hours without fever, without fever-reducing medication.
- **Scarlet fever (notifiable):** Readmission 24 hours after the start of effective antibiotic treatment and the symptoms have subsided; without treatment, at the earliest 24 hours after the symptoms have subsided.
- **Rubella (notifiable):** Readmission after the symptoms have subsided, at the earliest on the 8th day after the onset of the rash.
- **Chickenpox (notifiable):** Readmission one week after the onset of an uncomplicated illness, after all blisters have completely crusted over.
- **Hand, foot and mouth disease:** Readmission one week after the onset of an uncomplicated illness, after all blisters have completely crusted over.
- **Severe cold symptoms (cough, runny nose, sore throat):** The child should feel healthy and be able to actively participate in lessons and everyday life at KiBi. In addition, possible infection of other children should be avoided.

For all of the illnesses listed, the following naturally applies:

Your child's health and well-being are our top priority. Your child should only return to school or the KiBi area once they have fully recovered. In addition, possible infections must be avoided for the sake of the entire school community.

2. Head lice infestation

If a suspected case is detected at primary school/KiBi, the affected child – as well as any siblings – must be picked up and checked at home. The child must stay at home on the day the infestation is detected. From the following day, after treatment has begun, the child may return to school – a doctor's note is not required.
